## PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

*"Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.'" (John 12:20-21)*

Recently in Confirmation Class, the young people and I were studying the Acts of the apostles, specifically their sharing of the Gospel and their invitation for others to come, see, and follow Jesus. When discussing unintentional AND intentional missed opportunities to follow in the apostles' footsteps, I recounted a specific time when I was shopping with my daughter, Jessica, who was nearing two years old at the time. An elderly gentleman struck up a conversation in the check-out line. In speaking about our families, he asked about my purchases. I shared that the dresses were for Sunday School, with the pretty white one being for Easter. His response and my missed opportunity haunt me, still today. With his head hung, my elderly friend said in a disheartened tone, barely above a whisper, "I haven't been to church in a very long time." His body language indicated he was on the verge of crying. Instead of offering non-judgmental comfort, rather than asking him to share more of his story or offering him an invitation to join our family at church, I simply said, "I'm sorry" and abruptly ended our conversation.

Our confirmation students, each had their own story of a missed opportunity to "share Jesus."

A friend of mine tells a different story. In college, she sold books door to door. Once, she approached a single-family home (she called it a shack) with a door that was cock-eyed and barely hanging on its hinges. Walking up to the door, she caught whiff of an indiscernible stench that almost made her turn away. However, in Sales School, she'd been taught to knock on every door. Since the door looked "iffy" she knocked on the porch window. A young mother greeted her and opened the door with two near-naked children. When she told the young woman that she was selling books, her face lit up. Joyfully, she asked my friend, "Do you have any about Jesus?" And when she said "yes", the young mother came back with a dirty jar filled with coins that she eagerly emptied into my friend's hands. The young mother then said, "I want Jesus for my kids."

Since sharing these two "evangelism" experiences, I've thought often about the elderly man I'd met at K-Mart and the young mother and her children that my friend had encountered, when selling books. It was an apparent turning point in both of our faith journeys. Thinking about my experience, even today, I feel ashamed about my lack of courage and the missed opportunity to "share Jesus" with someone who obviously trusted me enough to be vulnerable and who had boldly opened a door that I might offer him an invitation to church or at least into a conversation to speak more about his relationship with Jesus and "the church." My friend still struggles with accepting the woman's last few coins, rather than just giving her the book. She wonders how the children grew up.

I wonder if the elderly man died secure in his relationship with Jesus. My friend hopes the young family was able to move out of their "shack" and into a clean place with a safe door. But it is the man's look of hunger for a relationship with Jesus and a church family, and the young mother's question that has stayed with me the most, "Do you have any about Jesus?" Both the unspoken and the spoken requests, are like the plea from John quoted above, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

Aren't people still asking this today? To see Jesus and to be seen *by* Jesus. To truly see and be seen in a holy community. In this time in history when so much of life is difficult – in our personal lives, in the "church," in our nation, and around the globe – we are all longing for Jesus. The very world, in its beauty and in its brokenness, is longing for Jesus. I encourage us, as we gather for our annual meeting – as we review last years' report that speaks about the budget, maintenance of our church facility and parsonage, worship attendance, salaries, mission, outreach, Sunday School, and all of the things needed to keep the *organization* of church going – to also, think about the indirect question of the elderly man and the direct question of the young woman, "Do you have any about Jesus?" It is the same human longing that goes back to those Greeks who ran into Philip one day 2000 years ago. "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." I pray that as we gather, some of our conversation will about opportunities taken to share Jesus AND how you may have received Jesus, through our ministries and your relationship with God and one another. I hope we can speak honestly, too, about missed opportunities and how we might do "better" in 2025.

What are some ways that "Jesus" has been made tangible in our community? Too, where are we falling short? Where is Jesus being shown to us outside of the church buildings as well as, outside of *Christian* community. Above all things, I pray that as we gather, we will experience the love and grace of Jesus in our celebration and review of our life and ministry together in 2024. While we don't have the answer for all things that are happening or are coming in this next year, we do know this, Jesus is with us! And there is plenty of Jesus to go around!

Please know, that when I see you, I see Jesus. In 2024, I was made especially aware of Jesus living within you and flowing through you, in the passing of my beloved mother, Cora. Thank you for the honor of serving as your pastor, preacher, teacher, and shepherd. I am so thankful for you and very appreciative of our 19 years of ministry together.

## JAM (Jesus and Me) YOUTH MINISTRY

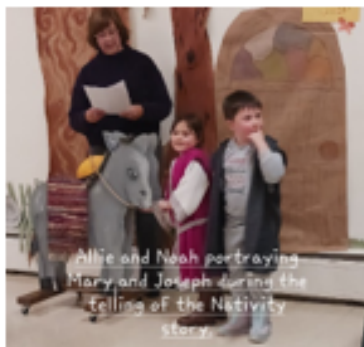
JAM (Jesus and Me) youth ministry continues to be a part of Starview UCC's outreach mission. During 2024, we offered a 13-week (Feb to May) and a 14-week (Sep to Dec) session. Six to eight youth participated in each session.

During the Spring session, each week of the program included dinner with an after-dinner activity. And D Bible Study was separated into 2 groups – K-Grade 2 and Grade 3 and up. The K-Grade 2 studied the GenOn Ministries curriculum titled "God Loves Me" and the Grade 3 and up studied the GenOn Ministries curriculum titled "Old Testament – Servants of God".

Worship Arts consisted of learning to worship God through the use of voice, bells and boom wackers.

A mission project was added to the session. The youth made 39 no-sew fleece blankets. The materials were sponsored by the youth and the congregation. The blankets were given to residents at Normandie Ridge and Yorkview nursing homes.

We celebrated the end of the session with a magic show by Cam-Tastic.



The Fall Session followed the same plan as the Spring Session. On November 6, the group hosted US Armed Forces veterans from the congregation for dinner. "Bring A Friend" night was hosted by the group on December 4. Bible Study groups finished the curricula from the Spring Session. During Worship Arts, the youth learned and rehearsed a Christmas program that told the Nativity story using song, American sign language and drama. The program was presented during the Celebration Night.

The mission project this session was making craft kits for Caitlin's Smiles, a non-profit based in Harrisburg that provides Smile Bags to kids in the hospital. Each week the youth received supplies to make 10 craft kits and returned the finished kits the next week. The youth made a total of 779 craft kits – 126 courage bracelet kits, 337 butterfly ring kits, and 316 snail craft kits. The kits were donated to Caitlin's Smiles and received by Mr. Chad Ruby, board member of Caitlin's Smiles during the Celebration Night.

## CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE

The Roof Capital Campaign Committee consisting of Gary Knisely, Chairman, Vicki Knisely, Tom Hoover, Cathy Rentzel, Claire Moore, Bill Schaeffer, Sr., and Pastor Laura Baker met monthly in 2024 to organize and lead the first capital campaign of Starview UCC in many years to raise funds necessary to restore the church roof and some gutters. The capital campaign was kicked off by Gary Knisely announcing to the Congregation in January 2024 that the \$50,000 goal was planned to be raised over a three-year period from 2024 through 2027.

The Committee first approached the current Church Council and Capital Campaign Committee members to make leadership gifts and pledges toward the campaign. As a result, total leadership and member gifts of \$26,000 were received as of December 31, 2024.

The Committee approached national United Church of Christ and Penn Central Conference leaders to participate in a kickoff luncheon for the Capital Campaign. The kickoff luncheon was held on September 22, 2024 with Reverend Carrie Call, the Penn Central Conference Chair, providing the sermon at the worship service prior to the kickoff luncheon and attending the luncheon.

In November 2024, the Capital Campaign Committee and Church Council interviewed Miller's Roofing, Dillsburg, PA; RE Kuba Construction, York, PA and Stan's Roofing, Mt. Wolf, PA regarding their respective quotes for the Church roof replacement and gutter and spouting replacement of the Christian Education Building wing through Spring 2025. The final quotes were:

Miller's Roofing	\$61,100.00
RE Kuba Construction	\$49,103.00
Stan's Roofing	\$49,700.00

At Church Council's December 10, 2024 meeting it was decided to recommend Stan's Roofing be awarded the contract subject to Congregation's approval on January 19, 2025.

At the special Congregational meeting on January 26, 2025, the Congregation approved the awarding of the church roof and gutter replacement project to Stan's Roofing in the amount of \$49,700. The work will begin in Spring 2025.

In the course of the three roofers examining the church to determine their roof quotes, one roofer recommended that the masonry damage of the church building be repaired. Gary Knisely met several times with Chris Lutter Masonry, New Freedom, PA and K&W Masonry Foundation, Spring Grove, PA. Preliminary quotes in the range of \$5,450 to \$25,609 have been received based on the extent of repair. Both contractors recommend that some masonry work should be completed in 2025 - 2028. Council has yet to meet to discuss this project.

The Roof Capital Committee has decided to become the Capital Campaign Committee to address future capital projects such as masonry damage, window replacement, parsonage roof and sanctuary carpet.

The Capital Campaign Committee has solicited proposals for the parsonage roof replacement from the same three roofing contractors.

It is important for the Congregation to be proactive in identifying and raising funds for specific capital projects to preserve and improve our Church and Parsonage.

## PROPERTY COMMITTEE

In April, the storm windows were pushed up and the screens pulled down. The timer was replaced on the flood lights for the cross on front of the church. The Easter Banners were changed outside.

In May, the parsonage rear porch was stripped, sanded and painted. The fascia board under the spouting was replaced.

In June, the flower beds at the church were weeded.

In July, the drain was repaired for the 3 compartment kitchen sink. The hand railing in the social hallway entrance was sanded and restained.

In August, weed control was sprayed in the parking lot and around the flower beds and trees. A breaker was replaced for the receptacles in the social hall.

In September, weed control was sprayed in the parking lot, around the flowers beds, and around the trees.

In October, the wild trees that were growing in the bushes were removed. A direct wired door bell was installed at the food pantry door. The flower beds and the beds around the trees were weeded. LED lights were installed at the entrance to the church.

In November, the panic bar for the sanctuary door was repaired. The lights around the steeple were replaced with LED lights. The parsonage gutters were cleaned and leaf guards installed. The storm windows were pulled down the screens push up.

In December, the photo cell and sodium light were replaced at the back double doors of the church.

## MUSIC DEPARTMENT

Words from the Music Director/Organist

God has a way of getting you where he wants you. Being one of the last 5 trying to keep Salem open, I wasn't sure what or where I was going after the Worship Services ceased. (The closure is still NOT final). Impromptu playing is beyond my scope, and I'm not a recitalist, but I do enjoy playing and singing hymns. Having received several phone calls, I came to Starview for a meeting and was met by 4 warm and caring people. The meeting had lasted approximately 3 hours and I could feel the spirit present, but felt this was too much for me to handle. By July 1<sup>st</sup>, I decided to try, and if it wasn't a go, Cody could return. Fast forward...we've made it through a year (17 months). I'm still learning what works here. People and abilities are different and we are gradually finding our rhythm.

- December 21<sup>st</sup>, Kat led folks Christmas caroling. I think they will do it again next year (2025).

Thank you to Leslie for getting the music and copies back so quickly. My previous choir schedule ran from October to June, and I was scurrying the last few days to be ready for the September start date.
