# SUNG RESPONSE



## **Scripture Reading**

Responsive and Participatory with Congregation Ezekiel 37:1-10 Led by: Rev. Martha Boyer

## **Introduction and History of Halloween Skeletons and Ghosts**

Before reading tonight's scripture passage, commonly referred to as "The Valley of Dry Bones," I invite you to take hold of the Easter Eggs on your tables. You will participate in the reading by rattling your Easter Eggs at various points in the to symbolize the sound of rattling bones. In choosing the Easter egg for our rattle, we are reminded too of the Easter's promise – Jesus rose from the grave! LIFE is victorious! Death cannot contain us! Through Jesus' resurrection we have life eternal!

To prepare ourselves to hear about Ezekiel's vision of Dry Bones, we will hear FIRST, a brief history about dry bones or Skeletons and ghosts on Halloween. After which, we will learn about the context for Ezekiel's vision and read the passage together in dramatic form using our Easter Eggs as rattling bones! Pay attention to, for moments when you will be asked to howl (or ooooooooh) – not to represent ghosts of course, but instead, the resurrecting breath of God's Spirit.

So about skeletons and ghosts – it IS brief... Graveyards and haunted houses, skeletons and ghosts are simply, symbolic reminders of the otherworld, death, and human mortality. Hence, their connection to that ancient Celtic tradition known as Samhain (*pronounced sow-win*).

As for our scripture passage...Ezekiel was a prophet and priest in ancient Israel in the 6<sup>th</sup> century BCE. God had commissioned Ezekiel to deliver messages to God's people, who had been

captured and taken hostage by the vicious army of a nation called Babylon. It was a very dark and terrorizing time for God's people. The bones in Ezekiel's vision represented their feelings of hopelessness. They'd been torn apart. They felt disjointed and dead.

They wondered if they would ever know life again. They wondered if God could restore them and would ever be able to bring them back to their homeland.

Let us read together in dramatic form, the Word of the Lord, with each table participating accordingly, by rattling your dry bone Easter Eggs and howling like the wind as indicated.

Ezekiel said, "The Lord took hold of me, and I was carried away by the Spirit of the Lord to a valley filled with bones. He led me all around - among the bones - that covered the valley floor. They were scattered everywhere! They laid across the ground and were completely dried out.

Then the Lord asked me, "Son of man, can these bones become living people again?"

"O Sovereign Lord," I replied, "only you know the answer to that question."

Then the Lord gave me a command saying, "Speak a prophetic message to disjointed skeletons, and say, 'Dry bones, listen to the word of the Lord!

This is not what I say, but what the Sovereign Lord says: Look! I am going to put breath into you and make you live again! I will put flesh and muscles on you and cover you with skin. I will put breath into you, and you WILL come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord."

So I spoke this message, just as the Lord commanded me!

Suddenly as I spoke, there was a rattling noise all across the valley.

Table 1 rattle your "bones." Continue to rattle as scripture is read...

The bones of each body came together and attached themselves as complete skeletons.

Table 1 AND 2 rattle your "bones." Continue to rattle as scripture is read...

Then as I watched, muscles and flesh formed over the bones.

Tables 1, 2 AND 3 rattle your "bones." Continue to rattle as scripture is read...

Then skin formed to cover their bodies, but they still had no breath in them.

Everyone RATTLE your bones – LOUDLY.

### STOP when indicated...Be SILENT...

Then the Lord said to me, "Speak a prophetic message to the winds, son of man! Speak a prophetic message and say, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Come, O breath, from the four winds! Breathe into these dead bodies so they may live again."

So I spoke the message as the Lord commanded me...

### EVERYONE howl and swoosh like the wind....Continue as scripture is read.

breath came into those dead bodies. They all came to life and stood up on their feet—a great army!

### Wind and bodies are silence...

Then the Lord said to me: "Son of man, these bones are my people. They cry out, 'Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.'

Therefore say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD promises: My people, I am going to open your graves and bring you up from them; I will bring you back to the land of Israel. Then you, my people, will know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. I will put MY Spirit in you and you WILL live..."

This is God's Good News – DEATH is not the end of God's story, nor our story as God's holy people. Life eternal, through Christ, reigns victorious!

All the people: Thanks be to God for this Good News!

## Offering Invitation and Prayer of Dedication with a History of Soul Cakes

Having received God's Good News, we come to that moment when we have an opportunity to share and spread that Good News, through the committed giving of our time, talent, and money. The act of "giving and receiving" is also a favorite Halloween tradition that takes place in the form of "trick-or-treating." It is from the English Catholics, that we get begging from door to door on the third day of the celebration we're studying. It happens on November 2<sup>nd</sup> and is called All Soul's Day.

Historically Christian children would go door to door, begging their neighbors for a "Soul Cake," for which in return, they would offer a prayer for their neighbors' deceased loved ones. Instead of knocking on a door and saying, "Trick-or-treat," children would either say:

All people: A Soul Cake, a Soul Cake, have mercy on all Christian souls for a soul cake!

All people: Soul, soul, an apple or two. If you haven't an apple, a pear will do! One for Peter, two for Paul, three for the Man who made us all!

While Soul Cakes were originally a type of shortbread, it is said that a clever medieval cook wanted to make Soul Cakes designed to remind people of eternity, so she cut a hole in the middle of round cakes before frying them, thereby inventing donuts!

While we don't offer Soul Cakes to spread God's Good News, we do offer a generous portion of our time, talent, and finances so that others may taste and share in God's love and light. Let us now dedicate all we promise, with a prayer. (A white offering box is located by the door as you enter and exit, into which you can place your financial offerings)

All people:

Loving God, we thank you for the gift of life and the gift of faith. We thank you for the love and support of those who have gone before us, especially those who have died. We ask that you bless our offering and use it to further your kingdom here on earth. We dedicate ourselves to your service and pray that you will use us to bring hope, healing, and joy to those around us. Amen.
