THE ANIMALS TELL THE STORY

This Lent and Easter season, we will journey through Scripture by listening closely to the animals who appear in the biblical story – creatures who witness God's covenant, vulnerability, provision, and new life. From wilderness encounters to resurrection mornings, these companions help us see familiar texts with fresh eyes and deeper wonder as we walk the path from ashes to alleluias.

The Animals Tell the Story



During the 2026 Lenten season, Starview UCC invites you into a meaningful journey through scripture titled **Living Lent: The Animals Tell the Story**.

From wilderness encounters to resurrection mornings, animals appear again and again in the biblical story. Often overlooked, these companions become powerful witnesses - helping us see familiar texts with fresh eyes as we walk the path from ashes to alleluias. Each week, an animal will help reveal something true about the character and mission of Jesus: his humility, his grief, his warnings, his forgiveness, his steadfast love, and ultimately, his resurrection hope.

Sunday Morning Worship

Sunday worship takes place at 9:45 AM, unless otherwise noted. Each service will introduce a new animal and a new lens through which to encounter Christ during Lent.

Wednesday Evening Soup & Study

On **Wednesday evenings from 6:00–7:30 PM**, we will gather downstairs in Fellowship Hall, around tables, over a bowl of soup and fresh bread. Together, we will delve more deeply into the prior Sunday's scripture readings while "practicing" some Bible 101 techniques known as biblical hermeneutics.

This means - we will slow down and learn how to read Scripture more thoughtfully - exploring its original context, listening for how different parts of the Bible speak to one another, and bringing those ancient texts into honest conversation with our lives and the world today. No prior knowledge is required. All materials are provided.

Come hungry - and be nourished, both spiritually and physically.

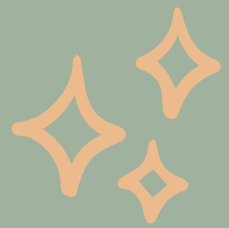

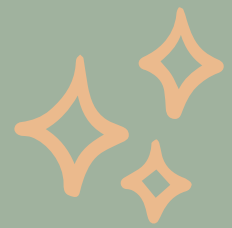

Meeting in welcoming spaces such as Sign of the Horse, Conewago Inn, Olive Garden, Parma Pizza and Lyndon Diner, the ministry creates a safe environment where questions are welcomed and stories are shared.

Each gathering typically begins with a simple ice-breaker and unfolds into thoughtful dialogue that weaves together faith, culture, and everyday experience. Family-friendly and open to all, Pub, Grub, and God helps us to meet God where we are while nourishing our faith and connections with one another.

SHADOWS TO SUNSHINE

Every other Monday at 6pm

SHADOWS TO SUNSHINE (every other Monday at 6 PM, church parlor) is a compassionate, faith-centered ministry designed to offer support, understanding, and hope for anyone navigating life's emotional and mental health challenges. Grounded in the belief that no one should walk through difficult seasons alone, the ministry creates a safe, confidential, and non-judgmental space where participants are invited to share, listen, and reflect at their own pace. Through thoughtfully facilitated sessions, gentle grounding practices, guided conversation, and spiritual reflection, Shadows to Sunshine helps participants name their experiences, build self-awareness, and discover tools for resilience and self-care -emotionally, mentally, physically, socially, and spiritually. The emphasis is NOT on fixing or diagnosing, but on walking together, honoring each person's story, and affirming that seeking support is a sign of strength.

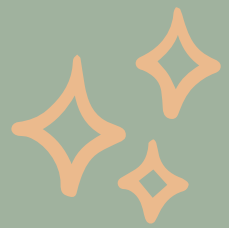

GRIEFSHARE AT STARVIEW UCC

Support for Those Grieving the Death of a Loved One

If you are grieving the loss of someone you love, we want you to hear this first: you are welcome here, and you do not have to walk this road alone.

This February, Starview UCC is offering a new cycle of GriefShare, a 13-week support group focused specifically on bereavement - the grief that follows the death of a loved one, whether the loss is recent or long past. This group is distinct from our *Mental Health Support Group*, which provides care for broader emotional and mental health concerns. GriefShare centers intentionally and solely on loss through death, and the journey toward support and healing that follows.

- Sessions are 2 hours in length
- Location: Upstairs, in the Church Parlor

WHAT TO EXPECT

A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week journey, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what is "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief in all its unpredictability - and gain compassionate support each step of the way.

Each weekly gathering includes:

- Expert-led video teaching
- Guided reflection and conversation
- Scripture and prayer
- Space to participate, listen, or simply be present

YOUR PERSONAL WORKBOOK

At Orientation, each participant receives a personal GriefShare workbook - yours to keep. It is filled with practical tools, journal prompts, and weekly reflection space to guide you long after each session ends.

FLEXIBILITY ON THE GRIEF JOURNEY

- You may join at any point in the 13-week cycle - no need to start with Session 1.
- Missed sessions can be picked up in future cycles.
- The 13-week program may be completed up to 3 times, at your own pace, and does not need to be completed consecutively or back-to-back.

A COMMUNITY OF SUPPORT

Grief can make the world feel smaller, even as love for the one we've lost remains vast. In GriefShare, we hold space for both truths - the ache of loss, and the endurance of love.

CLOSING WITH HOPE & RESILIENCE

Our final session on May 18 will include a Closing Banquet, a gentle celebration of courage, resilience, and the shared witness that hope can take root again, even in tender soil.

HE CHOSE THE NAILS ~ MAX LUCADO

Every gift from God reveals his love, but no gift reveals his love more than the gifts of the cross. Have we taken time to open these? As we do, we find that Jesus did it all just for us. Unwrap the gifts of grace as if for the first time. And as you touch them as you feel the timber of the cross and trace the braid of the crown and finger the point of the spike pause and listen. Perchance you will hear him whisper: I did it just for you.

The last moments leading up to Jesus' death were not left up to chance. God chose the path; he selected the nails. Our Lord planted the trio of crosses and painted the sign. And in those details are gifts Christ provided for us. The cross. The thorns. The nails. His seamless robe. The empty tomb. God didn't have to give us all these things, you know. The only required act for our salvation was the shedding of blood, yet he did much more. So much more.

Experience Lent as a time not to just give up something, but to prepare to receive good gifts from God.

Take comfort that Jesus understands everything you face in this life.

Stand firm in the promise that you are forgiven, and you are welcome in God's presence, no matter what you've done.

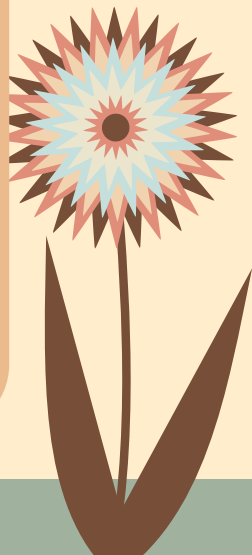

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY



As we anticipate the upcoming season of possible inclement weather, there are a few reminders regarding Sunday morning worship during these times.

There are multiple ways that you can locate the information about Sunday morning worship services - specifically, if BOTH in person and virtual will be offered or if the service will be held virtually, ONLY.

A decision will be made by 8 PM on SATURDAY evening, by a team consisting of the Council President, Worship Chair, Music Director, and Pastor Laura. Their decision will be based on the weather information available to them at that time, realizing that the weather may change and be inaccurate by the next morning. Even so, the decision made on Saturday evening, will NOT change on Sunday morning. The decision made Saturday will stand.
