

STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

Church Members are invited to come forward to help strip the altar and carry the paraments and adornments out of the worship space. The altar represents Jesus' presence in our midst. The stripping of the altar symbolizes the violent stripping, repulsive spitting, and cruel taunting of our Savior.

THE STREPITUS

Symbolizes the earthquake and tearing of the temple curtain, which happened when Jesus "gave up his spirit."

THE CHRIST CANDLE IS EXTINGUISHED AND REMOVED FROM THE SANCTUARY

The Christ Candle's removal signifies the apparent victory of evil.

SILENCE

Represents the 3 hours of darkness that happened when Christ died on Calvary.

The return symbolizes our hope and anticipation of Christ's resurrection.
