THE CANDLE IS LIT

Liturgist: John 16:33 records these words of Jesus: “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”
All: *Eternal God, as we await the coming of our Savior, help us to find inner quietness and an awareness of your abiding presence. Let this season be a time when we concern ourselves with the spiritual blessings of hope, peace, joy and love, rather than material gifts. Amen.*

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

We confess to you the ways in which we have added to that darkness rather than obeyed our call to live as children of the light. We ask your forgiveness: for times when we celebrate violence and belittle peace; for times when we fight amongst ourselves; for times when we forget that we are all children of God; for times when we do not stand up for the most vulnerable and helpless among us. By your tender mercy, may the dawn from on high break upon us, and give light to those of us that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. Amen.*
